

What is IEP?

OneVoice's **International Education Programme** in the UK works with **schools, universities and communities**, running **conflict resolution programmes** that engage students and community members in forward-thinking dialogue about solutions, rather than backward-looking debates about respective historical narratives. This future-focused initiative is based on three important steps that need to be embraced for a shift in people's thinking towards ending the Israeli-Palestinian conflict:

3 steps towards ending the conflict

what will it look like?

Visualization: As part of our Imagine 2018 campaign, our network of youth leaders across Israel and the West Bank are conducting film interviews with hundreds of Israelis and Palestinians, asking them to offer visions of 2018 if a peace agreement is signed versus maintaining the status quo. These visions are being compiled, translated, and cataloged in an online portal allowing citizens around the world to view these visions for the future. In parallel, UK students and community members are invited to offer their own visions for a peaceful future.

what will it take?

Education: On our week-long **educational tours**, Israeli and Palestinian youth leaders visit UK schools and communities. During and after these tours, OneVoice **training sessions** equip students and community members with the capacity to promote pragmatic attitudes towards the conflict within their own communities, and build bridges with others. The communication link with the youth leaders back in Israel and Palestine is always open and ongoing.

Mobilization: With guidance and resources from OneVoice, UK student and community members are invited to continue dialogue in their own communities, while implementing **regional campaigns** tailored to the needs of their local society that support calls for a focus on **ending the occupation of Palestine**, and **establishing a peace agreement**.

what is your role?

Programme details: schools, communities and universities

The schools programme, which has been designed and piloted with the input of prominent educational and religious leaders, is designed for 15 to 18 year-olds and is compatible with the RE, PSE, Citizenship and History curriculums. Students have the opportunity to interact with Palestinian and Israeli young people and do activities that focus on proposing and discussing possible solutions for the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The sessions also can be applied to community youth groups.

In communities, OneVoice brings young Israelis and Palestinians to engage in Q&A discussions, and also offers conflict resolution training sessions for community members who want to learn skills that will help them become leaders within their own societies in working towards reducing tensions and polarisation caused by reactions to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.
